### **Capital District Chapter of the NYS School Facilities Association Scholarship Fund**

**PURPOSE:** The purpose of the scholarship is to provide tuition assistance to a member's immediate family (unmarried child), or a student from member's school district, who is a member of the Capital District Chapter New York State School Facilities Association. This scholarship is for a student pursuing a vocational career related to facilities management.

**AWARD BENEFITS:** Recipients will be awarded an amount to be determined after a review by the Capital District Chapter Scholarship Committee.

\* The amount awarded may not exceed one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) per year, per applicant.

\* The total amount distributed by the Chapter from the established fund may not exceed three thousand dollars (\$3,000.00) annually.

\* At no time shall the amount awarded exceed the expenses incurred by the applicant.

**ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENT:**

Applicant must meet the following eligibility requirements:

1. Be scholastically responsible with a grade point average of "C" or better at the time of the application;
2. Submit a completed application, along with an official transcript (if applicable) of course(s) taken to date and a personal letter of reference;
3. Along with the application, you will be required to submit an essay 200 words or more in length describing what your long-term goals are and how you hope to achieve them.

4. Provide by Mr. Grant ----- proof of membership (sponsor's membership) in the Capital District Chapter of the NYS School Facilities Association for at least two years. This membership must be in current good standing.
  5. Submit a description of curriculum, course(s) to be taken from the higher education institution.

  - c. Remain enrolled in an educational institution majoring in a curriculum leading to an ABET accredited Bachelor of Science Degree in the field of Civil Engineering.
