Eligibility Requirements:

1. Currently enrolled in a High School within Rensselaer County, NY
2. Graduating senior attending 2- or 4-year college in fall of 2019
3. While all are encouraged to apply, preference will be given to students pursuing a career in law enforcement or criminal justice.

Essay #1: 50 to 200 words, not judged on length – Select one person in your life who has been a significant influence on you and explain why.

Essay #2: 50 to 200 words, not judged on length – Explain what your plans are after college and how you will utilize your education.

Both essays should be computer printed and must be attached.

MARGARET J. KINN SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship will be given to a deserving Berlin High School graduate pursuing a business finance or accounting degree program:

- The student must be enrolled in a 2 or 4 year college
- The student must maintain a 3.0 GPA and will receive \$1,000 for each year completed for the length of the program
- This scholarship will be awarded to a student to whom it will make a difference to, not based upon their highest GPA, but who will benefit the most.

To apply, students must write an essay explaining why they are interested in their chosen field, their outside work and extra-curricular activities while at Berlin Central School District and what they hope to do after graduating from college. Selection will be made by the Berlin Alumni Association.

CINDY HARRISON MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Basic Criteria:

Awarded to s current-or-former Berlin High School graduate who has overcome obstacles and/or struggled through adversity and who exemplifies the interests and values of former firefighter Cindy Harrison as evidenced by a caring nature, active involvement, and concern for others. (Refer to attached bio.)

Additional Applicant and Eligibility Criteria and Considerations:

- While aptitude is important, eligibility will not necessarily be based on scholastic ranking.
- Persons who attend Berlin High School for a minimum of two (2) years and have earned a GED will also be eligible to apply.
- Previous successful recipients of this award may apply.
- In the event that two (2) or more candidates are serious contenders, current class graduates will be given priority over previous graduates or GED recipients.
- The selection committee reserves the right to request personal interviews with applicants.

Application Requirements:

- A completed Petersburg Fire Department/Cindy Harrison Memorial Scholarship application must be submitted. DEADLINE: May 24, 2019.
- Applicant must write and submit a brief essay summarizing how he/she meets the basic criteria.
- Two (2) letters of recommendation from non-relatives must be submitted.
- Applicant must be planning to attend college or vocational training and be fully matriculated prior to receiving the award/grant.

Additional Information:

- The amount of this award may vary from year to year based on investment and/or other variables.
- The award may be divided between two (2) recipients.
- Applicants may apply for this scholarship every year, but awards may not necessarily be given each year.
- All determinations relative to above – as well as selection of the scholarship winner(s)-will be made by a designated committee.

Along with the application, the following criteria must be met.

Instructions to Student Applicant:

On a separate sheet(s) of paper, please provide the following information:

1. In 500 words (+/-), discuss why you chose to pursue civil engineering and your future plans in this field;
2. List any voluntary or extra-curricular activities you have participated in during high school, and;
3. Include your official school transcript.

Important Scholarship Award Conditions:

1. The scholarship award amount of \$1,000 per year for up to 4 years is renewable annually at the sole discretion of the ASCE Mohawk-Hudson Section and may be suspended and/or not renewed if the conditions herein are not satisfied.
2. To remain eligible for the scholarship award, the recipient shall:
 - a. Submit his/her transcript at the end of each school year to the Mohawk-Hudson Section;

- b. Minimum grade point average (GPA) of 3.0 or higher is expected (Award may be continued for GPA between 2.5 and 3.0 at the discretion of the Mohawk-Hudson Section Board), and;
- c. Remain enrolled in an educational institution majoring in a curriculum leading to an ABET accredited Bachelor of Science Degree in the field of Civil Engineering.
