Albany Literacy Zone

At the South End and West Hill/Arbor Hill Literacy Zone settings, adult learners can gain the knowledge, skills and support needed for economic self-sufficiency.

Life and Workforce Skills

Coordinators at each Literacy Zone site work closely with community partners to create workshops designed to help individuals move beyond poverty and into the work world. These include lessons on creating a family budget, enrolling in health insurance, understanding legal rights, resume building, and much more.

Earn a High School Diploma

We can provide the education you need to prepare for the state's high school equivalency exam and earn a diploma.

Classes are open to students 17 years or older who lack a high school diploma and have left school.

Instruction is done by certified teachers who works with students to overcome their challenges so they can successfully pass the exam.

The curriculum focuses on preparing students in five subjects—reading, writing, social studies, science, and math.

The Test Assessing Secondary Completion (TASC) replaced the GED years ago as the only free, state-subsidized exam leading to a New York State High School Equivalency (HSE) Diploma.

Learn English

Classes are provided to help students improve English speaking, listening, reading and writing skills. Classes are free to students age 21 year or older.

The Capital District EOC can help you get the education and training you need for the future you want. We support you and your goals—whether that means a High School Equivalency diploma and college prep, or vocational training and a new career. Programs are no cost for those who qualify.

Since 1966, the Capital District Educational Opportunity Center (EOC), a division of Hudson Valley Community College and part of the State University of New York, has offered tuition-free academic and workforce development opportunities to disadvantaged and educationally under-prepared individuals. As a result, thousands of Capital Region residents have gained self-confidence in their own potential, realized career goals, and obtained self-sufficiency and economic independence.

Programs include: academic enrichment, building trades, college preparation, cosmetology (& state board exam preparation), culinary arts, high school equivalence (HSE) preparation, medical office administration, national work readiness credential exam, and many more!

Approximately 1,000 students enroll each year with more than 50,000 individuals served. Graduates secure entry-level positions in professional fields. The average age of students is 31 and the student body represents the diversity of the Capital Region.
