This Friday, October 31st, besides being Halloween, we have a special day of school spirit planned.

The first hour will be dedicated to our WEB/LINK program, which is designed as a student mentoring initiative for our 6th and 9th graders—the key transition years into middle and high school. Older students serve as mentors to help these younger Mountaineers build confidence, connection, and a sense of belonging at BMHS.

While grades 6 and 9 participate in WEB/LINK, grades 10–12 will work on creating their class banners. High school banners will be displayed in the gymnasium, and middle school banners will hang proudly in the middle school wing.

The day will culminate with our Mountaineer Pep Rally, organized by our incredible Student Council, who have worked hard to ensure that every student is engaged and involved.

ELA 11 Regents Exam

After thoughtful discussion and review, all students in ELA 11 will take the January Regents Exam. This decision provides several benefits:

- Historically, 11th grade is the year in which students take the most Regents Exams, and completing ELA in January will help reduce their overall testing load in June.
- It gives students an additional opportunity to pass the ELA exam, ensuring they have flexibility and time to improve if needed.
- Those who need additional support will have more time to strengthen skills before June.

This approach helps students manage their academic responsibilities more effectively while building confidence and readiness for graduation requirements.

Chronic Absenteeism – A Community Commitment

One of our top building goals this year is to improve student attendance. I've personally been making home visits and working closely with the Rensselaer County Sheriff's Office and the Rensselaer County Probation Department to support families in need.

We've also partnered with the County's Pre-PINS (Person In Need of Supervision) program. Pre-PINS is a preventive service designed to help families address chronic absenteeism before it becomes a legal matter. Together, we identify barriers—such as transportation, health, or motivation—and create personalized attendance plans to help students return to school consistently.

Regular attendance is one of the strongest predictors of academic success. Every day counts, and we're here to support every Mountaineer, every step of the way.

Quarter 1 & Early Release Drill

A reminder that Quarter 1 ends Friday, November 7th. Report cards will be available shortly thereafter.

Also on November 7th, we will hold our countywide Early Release Drill.

Students will be dismissed at 1:45 p.m. This annual drill is a state-mandated safety requirement that ensures we are prepared for any emergency requiring early dismissal. It allows us to practice our transportation and communication procedures in a controlled, safe environment.
